# **Annual School Report**

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#### I. Our School

#### (I) School Information

#### 1. Brief History

This school was founded by the Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China, in Kwai Chung, 1969, to meet the needs of the community for quality secondary education. With its close ties to Chuen Yuen Church, Chuen Yuen First Primary School, Chuen Yuen Second Primary School and Chuen Yuen Third Primary School, this new school was named Chuen Yuen College.

In 1969, there were altogether four classes in Form One and Form Two. The school had its first Form Five graduates in 1972. In September 1973, CCC Chuen Yuen College started its matriculation classes, in both Arts and Science streams, and developed to its full capacity as a 24-class grammar school. Later, floating classes were introduced in 1976 in response to the request from the Education Department. During the period from 1978 to 1985, the school also offered special education in some classes.

Mr. Cheung Wan Cha, the founding Principal of the school, retired in August 1983. Ms. Yau Oi Nam, Cheung's successor, migrated to Canada in 1992. Mrs. Lee Shek Yuk Yu then became the third Principal and she left the school in 2001. Mr. Wong Wai Yiu took up the principalship as the fourth Principal of the school in 2001 and he retired in August 2019. Mr. Ip Tin Yau joined service in 2019 and he is the fifth Principal of the school.

#### 2. Present Situation

a) Class structure and Curriculum

The school is an aided co-ed school with approximately 730 pupils. There are four classes in each form from Form One to Form Six.

The school is a grammar school offering a broad and balanced curriculum. A total of twelve electives are offered in senior forms to meet students' diversified needs. Other than academic subjects, we offer more than twenty clubs and societies to stretch the potential of our students.

b) Administration

The Incorporated Management Committee (IMC) of the school was established in September 2011 to replace the School Management Committee (SMC). The IMC is led by the Supervisor, sponsoring body managers, parent managers, an alumni manager, an independent manager, teacher managers and the Principal. It replaces the role of the SMC to manage the school. The IMC sets the goals and priorities for the school. It also formulates development directives, management policies and the use of resources according to the priorities.

The daily operation of the school is administered by the Executive Committee, which is headed by the Principal and further supported by two vice-principals and the chairpersons of major functional committees, namely: Academic; Discipline; Guidance; Religion; Extra-curricular Activities; Career Guidance and Moral and Civic Education. Regular meetings are called to plan, implement and evaluate the progress of school work.

#### c) Church Support

The CCC Chuen Yuen Church works closely with the school in religious missions. Rev Cheung Mun Yee serves as the school chaplain to advise the school on evangelical matters. She also helps the school to promote the Gospel among teachers and students on the campus. There are also representatives from CCC Chuen Yuen Church in the IMC of the School.

#### d) School Facilities

The school is situated in Kwai Chung Estate. It is a six-storey building with about 50,000 square feet. There are twenty-eight classrooms and fourteen special rooms including a multimedia language centre, two computer rooms, four laboratories, a library, a gym room and a big assembly hall. All classrooms and laboratories are air-conditioned and equipped with networked computers, LCD projectors and visualisers. There is also a playground and a car park on the school campus.

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## II Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns 2023-2024

Major Concern 1: Quality learning experiences

	1.1 Various teaching and learning strategies were adopted to achieve meaningful				
	learning. Inside the classroom, subject departments adopted different strategies to				
	enhance effective learning. Examples include: high-order thinking skills, grouping				
	strategies, interactive learning, enquiry approach, graphic organiser, note taking,				
	in-class exercises and vocabulary approaches. They also developed a number of				
	E-learning teaching activities to promote interactive learning and collaborative

	Teachers made use of different examination data to make improvements on teaching				
	and learning, including school examinations and test results, TSA results and				
	HKDSE results. Also used were the Knowledge Management system, "Diagnostic

2.	Target achieved. Students' horizons are broadened and their innovative potentials are unleashed.				
	2.1 Thematic approaches were conducted in cross-curricular reading and other learning activities.				
	Different departments developed their own reading plans. Topics included Biology,

	and the English department used the reading platform I-Learner and National				
	Geographic to promote reading across the curriculum. Our school won the award,

	2.2 To enrich students' learning experiences by providing learning experiences in authentic contexts.				
	Outside the classroom, teachers tried their best to provide form-based,				

cross-committee and cross-curricular life-wide learning activities under epidemic prevention measures. Activities included Outward Bound training, different leadership training camps, life education activities, an innovation tour in Cyber port, an inter-class STEAM competition and Mathematics Trail. In promotion of STEAM education, different STEAM activities, both individual and form based, were organised for junior form students, including a school-based STEAM project designed for S2 students. STEAM seeds were recruited in order to join various competitions. STEAM classroom activities were organized by the Science, Mathematics and Creative Technology Departments. STEAM weeks with different STEAM activities were organized for all students.

#### **Reflection**

- All teachers have adequate experience with eLearning. They did not hesitate to use it if the topics were suitable for eLearning.
- It was observed that most students could demonstrate the learning skills taught and were better engaged in the lessons. In view of the internal examination results, the performance of students had a progressive improvement.
- 3. Through participating in authentic contexts, students gained a lot of learning experiences, which was inseparable from daily life.
- Most students showed positive feedback on the STEAM classroom activities. They were engaged in the lessons.

#### Feedback and Follow-up

- The developed eLearning lessons and the enhanced assessment policies, such as P-I-E will be sustained as routine practice.
- 2. The life-wide learning days will be sustained as routine practice. The LAC strategies and reading across the curriculum will be further developed in the next cycle.
- Students are willing to try their best to overcome different learning difficulties. We should help them to get smart and stay smart in handling the secondary school curriculum.
- 4. To further develop students to attain a better achievement in the public examination, junior form students should have a solid foundation in academic aspects.

#### <u>Achievements</u>

- 1. Students are cultivated with positive values and attitudes to enhance their capacities so as to face the ever-changing society and challenges.
  - 1.1 Target achieved: Students demonstrated perseverance and showed confidence by participating in activities and competitions, attaining suitable levels.
  - ◆ The Moral & Civic Education Committee, Discipline Committee & Guidance Committee offered values education lessons and activities for all S1-S6 students. Over 90% of students agreed that the MCEd lessons enhanced their value awareness on perseverance, respect for others, responsibility, national identity, commitment, integrity, care for others, empathy, law-abidingness and diligence. Priority values of "Integrity" and "Law-abidingness" were emphasized. Scores in relevant APASO data (副量表:誠實-誠實表現、道德意識-重要性) has significantly increased.
  - National education was promoted to help students develop a sense of belonging to the country, an affection for the Chinese people and their sense of national identity was enhanced. 40 national flag raising ceremonies were held in all forms in 2023-2024, with 19 times on zoom. 14 talks about the national flag were given, too. 9 MCEd lessons related to national education (Chinese culture-cum-quiz competition) were conducted. Scores in relevant APASO data (副量表:國民身份 認同) were very encouraging.
  - Positive life attitude was promoted with a total of 26 Friday Stars Morning Assemblies conducted and the themes were shown as follows: 'Thanksgiving', 'Serving the community', 'Positivity', 'Diligence' and 'Integrity'. Sharing from teachers and students, song dedications and award presentations were commendable. Students and teachers showed positive responses.
  - A variety of outdoor activities such as the 'Crossroad' activity, flag selling, beach cleaning and elderly services by the Community Youth Chest were launched. Feedback received from the elderly participants was mostly positive. They expressed substantial satisfaction with the students' performances.
  - With the captivating theme of "Benevolence" (仁愛), the MCEd-cum-English

LaC Week reached its conclusion on Friday, 15 March. The week was a success, filled with an array of enchanting activities, including 3 booths co-hosted by the students and the elderly from the Windshield Charitable Foundation.

- ◆ Under the programme "Peer Power Student Gatekeeper Training Programme", 3 Booths entitled "Spread the Love, Care and Shine" Campaign were launched in November, March and May by the Guidance Committee. The activities built a friendly and supportive school climate. 2 Stress release activities (Tufting and Amusement park) were also launched in November and April. Music Therapy Talk and Workshop was launched for S5 in the 2nd term. All Emotional Education lessons and activities promoted mental health among students. Nearly 100% students agreed that the activities were joyful and released their stress. Scores in relevant APASO data (副量表:情绪-正向情緒、無負面情緒及無焦慮 及抑鬱徴狀) significantly increased.
- A variety of overseas exchange tours, including Australia and Shandong Jinan Sister School Cultural Exchange Programme, Sichuan, Shanghai, Hangzhou, Shaoxing, Hunan, Shenzhen & Zhuhai (a city in Guangdong), 澳洲珀斯交流考 察之旅、山東濟南姊妹學校文化交流之旅、珠海高中內地考察交流團、紹興、 湖南.....were arranged. A local tour, Handmade "Cheung Chau Bun" Workshop, was also introduced.
- A variety of outdoor activities by Gifted Education teams were launched. Students showed positive responses towards the course and agreed that the courses/ competitions made them able to broaden their horizons.
- 1.2 Target fully achieved: Through class management, students were better equipped to face challenges with suitable support from form teachers.
- There was more collaboration and discussion among committees and form teachers. Form teacher meetings were arranged in September, October and February. Feedback from Form Teachers' Questionnaire was encouraging.
- Class management Goal setting by class teachers & their students was completed. Term end review was completed in June. 19 classes (except S6) had 90% or above which partly or fully helped students achieve their goals.

- Class management Organized inter-class competitions in each form were held at least once a term. Students' responses were good and nearly all students showed good feedback, as observed by teachers. A total of four interclass Board Display Design Competitions were held. Interclass Games were also arranged on School Picnic Day. Other interclass competitions were also held.
- 7 Habits (proactive and positive culture) learning materials were delivered in MCED lesson for S1 to S6 students. School social workers provided relevant workshops for S2 and S3 students. Feedback from the Form Teachers' Questionnaire was encouraging.
- Target fully achieved: Adventure and Leadership training for all junior form students was completed.
- Students showed positive responses toward the activities. A certain number of training events were organised, including junior form monitors and monitresses, S4 peer counselors, prefects, gospel and caring Ambassadors and Committee members of Student Fellowship. The themes were shown as follows: "Perseverance", "Respect for Others", "Empathy" and "Unity". Feedback collected from different activities showed students were also aware of the strengths that they possess and started to serve others.
- Besides, training for class committee members, clubs committee members and house committee members was also provided. Students agreed that all training events built up their confidence in organizing activities/events and also enhanced their leadership skills.
- 2. Target fully achieved: Students are now able to master and manage their career and life planning
  - 2.1 To review the curriculum to target future studies
  - The curriculum was reviewed to target future studies. Talks, workshops, Career exploration activities and Career related group activities were provided.
  - Existing CLP lessons were updated to enhance students' self-understanding and development, goal-setting, career planning and management.

2.2 To show students multiple pathways to collaborate with different departments and committees

 Multiple pathways were provided with the collaboration of different departments and committees (The English Department, Academic Committee and IT team).
 Various workshops, visits and programmes to enhance students' career exploration were organized.

- 2.3 To conduct workshops of group and individual counselling to cater for students' diversity
- Workshops of group and individual counselling were conducted to cater to students' diversity. These included Job Shadowing activity programme, Career Live-taster programmes, Career Day, Non-JUPAS talk and the mock release of the HKDSE.

### **Reflection**

- 1. Students were cultivated with positive values and attitudes (PVAs) to enhance their capabilities so as to face the ever-changing society and challenges.
- 2. More interactive and reflective learning activities of the MCEd lessons were welcomed, and more should be designed. The MCEd week and Booth fostered a spirit of positivity among the students of Chuen Yuen.
- 3. Through class management, students were better equipped with suitable support from form teachers. Goal setting (A Step-By-Step guide to successful Life Goal Planning) helped students strive for excellence. Good support provided by form teachers helped students improve in perseverance. To help with class management, interclass competitions were held in each form, at least once a term. Students' responses were good and nearly all students showed good feedback.
- 4. 100% S1 students responded positively response in the career activity. Students agreed that they had a better understanding about the importance of goal setting. All S2 and S5 students were satisfied with the curriculum and agreed that it allowed them to explore more in different areas.
- 5. S4: 100%, S5: 100%, S6: 100% students agreed the career-related workshop /

programmes were useful.

### Feedback and Follow-up

- Quality Value Education Continue will be a major concern for the next development cycle with the following adjusted target: Applying positive psychology to further strengthen students' positive values and attitudes (including the twelve priority values and attitudes) through various programmes and experiences.
- 2. Quality Goal-setting, planning and evaluation will be incorporated as routine work.

#### 2. <u>Reports from the Academic Committee and Subject Departments</u>

#### (1) Academic Affairs

This was the fifth year of the five-year Annual School Plan, which promotes quality classroom learning and quality learning experiences.

Inside the classroom, subject departments adopted different strategies to enhance effective learning, including the training of higher-order thinking skills, interactive learning and enquiry approach. Most students could demonstrate the above skills taught and were better engaged in the lessons.

E-learning was well-adopted in all junior forms. With the help of the eBlackboards and mobile devices, subject departments incorporated a variety of e-learning tools in teaching, such as ChemEye, Geogebra, iScienceAR Nearpod, Popplet, Kahoot, and Book Creator. Teachers' competence in using IT tools was also enhanced through experience sharing. In the future, new pedagogical designs using AI technology will be further explored so that students of diverse learning abilities will be motivated and will probe more deeply into the subject matter.

STEAM education was promoted to help students establish positive values and attitudes. The STEAM Project continued in S2. Students had to identify a problem around their community and wrote a mobile APP to solve the problem. Throughout the project, creativity, information technology skills, communication skills, collaboration skills and problem-solving skills of students were enhanced.

Outside the classroom, two life-wide learning days were scheduled with form-based, cross-committee and cross-curricular life-wide learning activities. Students gained fruitful learning experiences in authentic contexts.

All in all, we are pleased to see our students make progress in their academic studies. We will continue to provide quality learning experiences both inside and outside the classroom, hoping that they will develop lifelong learning capabilities that are much needed in the ever-changing society.

#### (2) English Department

In 2023-2024, the English Department continued to consolidate reading and writing skills, with students showing notable improvement in higher-order thinking questions and grammar accuracy. The active participation in English-related activities and enhancement classes demonstrated the department's commitment to holistic student development

Several key areas for improvement were identified. Firstly, the curricula across all forms have been further trimmed, incorporating more interactive activities for junior forms and more explicit academic input for senior forms. The teaching of writing adopted a more structured and comprehensive approach, with specific attention given to consolidating vocabulary and increasing reading exposure in all forms. Additionally, department members were encouraged to devise tailormade teaching methods and develop both small-scale and large-scale assessments. The emphasis on spiral teaching and tiered tasks helped students internalize the four skills while catering to individual differences.

The department also enhanced student engagement through form-based activities and participation in more choral speaking and debate competitions, which increased incentives for English learning. The results were encouraging. Outside the classroom, students actively participated in English-related activities across various domains. One notable example was the English debate teams, where both the senior and junior teams participated in over 50 contests. After being promoted to Division 1, the two teams received various awards several times, with more than 10 debaters earning "Best Speaker" accolades over the past few years. We are pleased to see the flourishing development of the English debate teams.

English enhancement and remedial classes were held to consolidate students' knowledge and unleash their potential. These included intensive reading and writing classes, a newspaper reading workshop, English drama training workshops, a debate

workshop for beginners, and a JUPAS interview class.

By focusing on these areas, the English Department aimed to build on its successes and provide a high-quality education that prepares students for the complexities of the modern world.

#### (3) Mathematics Department

To promote students' interest in mathematics and enrich their learning experience, different outside classroom activities were organized. Activities for S1 on LWL day, the Math Trail Competition and Rummikub Exploration, were well attended. In the booth of STEAM week, different activities were introduced. Math Challenges from the Education University of Hong Kong were promoted. Different outside-classroom competitions and an inter-house mathematics competition were organized by Mathematics Society

To cater for learner diversity, mathematics enrichment courses for less able and high-ability students in different forms was arranged. With the help of our graduates, Math mentors, more support were given to students. Thr online assessment platform, Online Question Bank (OQB), was used. In order to increase students' engagement in the lessons, different classroom activities, including STEAM activities, were designed and peer lesson observations were arranged. Hands-on activities and eLearning activities were also arranged in the lessons. For better preparation, a department-based professional session in each term was organized

To broaden students' horizons and unleash their potentials, Mathematics Teams and a Rummikub Team were formed and more students were trained and encouraged to participate in different inter-school mathematics competitions. In this school year, the Mathematics competitions joined included: Singapore Math Challenge 2023, True Light Girls' Invitational Mathematics Contest 2023, 26th The Hong Kong Mathematical High Achievers Selection Contest, 41st Hong Kong Mathematics Olympiad, Hong Kong Mathematics Kangaroo Contest 2024, MathConceptition 2024, International Mathematical Olympiad Preliminary Selection Contest 2024, The Hong Kong Youth Mathematical Challenge and CCC Inter-school Number Combination Game Challenge 2324. In addition, an inter-school Rummikub Tournament was organized by our Rummikub Team and the 11th World Rummikub Championship Preliminary Selection Contest – Hong Kong and CCC Inter-school Rummikub Competition were joined. There were 98 awards this year and we got the Inter-School Contest Group Merits for S1, S2 and S3 in MathConceptition.

#### (4) History Department

To enhance teaching and learning effectiveness, various strategies including direct teaching and enquiry learning were implemented in this school year. MOI measures and collaboration with the English Department were conducted to facilitate students' history learning using English. Co-curricular activities were also proposed to unleash students' learning capacity. PSHE week was organized with the cooperation of the department of PSHE KLA. A tour to Yuen Long was arranged to facilitate learning experience in national security education and life-wide learning. In general, further effort should be made to strengthen students' demonstration of subject knowledge along with organizing learning activities in junior forms.

In short, initiatives to enhance students' academic performance were reviewed regularly and further progress is anticipated in the coming year.

#### (5) Geography Department

Different cross-curricular activities have been organized for students with the cooperation of other departments and societies. PSHE week was organized with the cooperation of the departments of PSHE KLA. S2 students took part in the Mainland studies tour during Life-wide Learning Day. S2 students also took part in a quiz activity with the application of different apps, to extend their learning with the cooperation of Life and Society (Junior). They also attended "Explore Urban landuse and Creative Writing" Tram Activity which was organized by the Geography and Chinese Department. S3 students carried out a water quality survey which was organized by the Geography, Biology and Chemistry Departments. S3 and 4 attended various talks and workshops such as "Slope Safety Talk" and "Astronomy Workshop" to extend their learning. S4 and 5 students also attended a field trip which was about the woodland ecosystem of Cheung Chau to strengthen their field work skills. They also took part in "Environmental Conservation Writing Competition" and "Your Story in Our Urban Forest Photography Contest".

#### (6) Integrated Science Department

The department facilitated students' understanding of the nature of science and the acquisition of science process skills. By implementing various learning activities,

students were nurtured to increase their interest, and to enhance their understanding of scientific knowledge. Besides, the department also advocated for them to make informed decisions about science-related issues in their daily life.

In order to enhance students' problem-solving skills and creativity while learning science, four small-scale STEAM activities were conducted in regular classroom settings this year. Meanwhile, a STEAM workshop related to Food Science and Forensic Science was held for S.1 students in the Life-wide learning day and a Project Learning (Cross-subjects) related to the design of a mobile app to serve the community was conducted in S.2.

Besides, students with good potential were nominated to join various inter-school competitions. Four S.2 students were nominated to join the Solar Power Model Car Design Competition organized by the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers. Students got valuable experience in STEAM education through the event.

On November 2023, S1 and S2 students were recruited to demonstrate workshops about electronic blocks, electric circuits, 3D pens and testing for starch to primary six students and their parents during the P6 Open Day. The workshops were completed smoothly and responses from students and parents were very good.

#### (7) Physics Department

For S3, a number of activities were held to cultivate students' interest in physics. An in-class STEAM activity was held. S3 students were asked to design and make a periscope. They were provided with two small mirrors. They needed to gather information of how a periscope works and the limitation(s) of a periscope. In addition, they were also given other challenges such as how to modify their design such that the periscope could help them see things behind them. The students enjoyed the activity a lot.

For S4 and S5, the students joined a study tour to Ocean Park. During their tour, the students jumped on the rides at Thrill Mountain and explored the underlying physics concepts. They applied physics concepts they learnt in school, together with their own experience during the rides at Thrill Mountain, to design exciting and safe ride models.

Throughout these activities, the students learnt how their textbook knowledge can be applied to real-life situations.

#### (8) Chemistry Department

Various activities were held to enrich students' learning experience. Ten S4 students demonstrated hands-on experiments to P6 students and their parents on Information Day. Forty S3 students participated in a cross-subject activity to analyze the quality of seawater at Tsing Yi Pier. Almost all participants agreed that they had learnt how to apply the knowledge and enjoyed the activity. During STEAM Week, a soap-making workshop was arranged for forty S3 students. Another STEAM activity, the making of scented candles, was also successfully conducted for all S3 students.

Several S5 students also actively participated in activities organized by external organizations. Two teams of S5, each comprised of three students, completed their projects on 'Fermentation in Chemistry' in Chemistry Olympiad 2024. The two teams studied the fermentation of yoghurt and food waste respectively. Although they did not win any prizes, the experience of investigating authentic issues was valuable.

#### (9) Biology Department

The Biology Department provides various learning experiences that enable students to develop scientific literacy, so that they can participate actively in the changing knowledge-based society, prepare for further studies in the fields related to life science, and become lifelong learners in Biological science.

Students with good academic performance in Biology were nominated to join the inter-school STEAM competition. Eight students from S.5 were nominated to join the Hong Kong Biology Literacy Award 2023/2024 organized by the H.K. Association for Science and Mathematics Education. One student was granted 'Second Class Honours' and one student was granted 'Merit'. Through these challenges, our elite students got valuable experience and their horizons were broadened.

Not only were elite students catered to, but opportunities were given to average students to serve as helpers during Open Day for P6 parents and students. Interesting experiments were demonstrated and a number of interesting models were exhibited. The performance of student helpers in explaining related biological concepts was good and a satisfactory response was observed from the guests.

#### (10) Economics Department

To promote self-regulated learning, the department implements the Diagnostic Feedback System (DFS) of HKEAA to identify the strengths and weaknesses of our students. Appropriate revision topics and questions in different levels were selected to cope with students' needs. QR codes of concepts-related videos were attached in a worksheet of each chapter for self-learning and revision.

To enhance teaching and learning effectiveness, various grouping strategies were implemented in S4 and S5. Discussion groups and study groups were formed to promote peer support in learning. An extended learning programme such as visiting the Hong Kong Monetary Authority (HKMA) was organized for S5 students after completing the topic "Money and Banking"

To cater for learner diversity, S4 and S5 students participated in the Economic Infographic Challenge (2023/24) which was organized by the EDB and co-organized by the centre for Sustainable Development Studies, Hong Kong Baptist University and Hong Kong Association for Economics Education.

To enrich students' learning experiences in authentic contexts of subject-related professions, selected S4 students were invited to participate in Financial Education "Teacher & Student" Series: Young Financial Talent Development cum Kick-off Ceremony of "2024 Hong Kong Financial Literacy Championship". Skills and working environment of the banking industry in the future was introduced by a representative of Hang Seng Bank.

(11) Computer and Creative Technology Department

The C&CT Department is dedicated to fostering student engagement in Information Technology by providing a diverse range of opportunities to explore and develop their talents. As technology rapidly evolves, we ensure our students are exposed to various IT services, courses, and competitions that broaden their understanding and skills.

Students receive hands-on instruction using a variety of programming tools such as micro:bit, mBOT, youCodia, Game Factory, and CoSpaces VR Programming. These tools are integrated into lessons that emphasize investigation, programming, and problem-solving. This approach helps students apply theoretical knowledge to real-world challenges, developing critical technical and creative thinking skills.

A major focus of the department is encouraging innovation and the practical application of design principles. Through projects like 3D Graphics Design, a 4-foot Walking Machine, and a Robot Finger with micro:bit, students gain valuable experience in using technology to solve complex problems. These projects are designed to enhance their technical capabilities and foster creativity in applying technological theories to practical scenarios.

This year, we actively participated in both English Week and STEAM Week by setting up engaging booths to showcase IT and AI knowledge. These events served as platforms to inspire students to embrace technology and foster a deeper understanding of its importance in their lives.

In addition, our department facilitated a school-based STEAM project for S2 students, focusing on computational thinking and coding. This initiative provided students with the essential skills needed in the digital age. We have worked closely with other departments, such as the BAFS, Mathematics, and Integrated Science departments, to promote cross-subject interaction. This cooperation has enriched students' learning experiences and encouraged interdisciplinary thinking.

This year, we also launched the IT Innovation Lab, which offers a variety of courses, events, and talks designed to spark interest in technology, STEAM, and AI. Through this initiative, we aim to cultivate a deeper passion for innovation and equip students with the skills to thrive in a tech-driven future.

#### (12) BAFS Department

## Digital Financial Literacy Programme For Youth 2023/24 - Four-Cell Story and Mini-Movie Competition

An S3 student joined the titled competition co-organized by The Investor and Financial Education Council (IFEC) and EDB. It is crucial to enhance the digital financial literacy of young people and cultivate proper financial attitudes and behaviours.

#### "Teacher & Student" Series: Dialogue with CEO

25 S4 students joined the titled seminar organized by the EDB on 1 March 2024. The seminar focused on the importance of developing proper values and attitudes towards financial and personal management. Our students had the invaluable opportunity to gain insights from the guest speakers and learned a great deal from their expertise and experiences.

## "Teacher & Student" Series: Young Financial Talent Development cum Kick-off Ceremony of "2024 Hong Kong Financial Literacy Championship

10 S2 and 9 S4 students joined the titled seminar organized by the EDB on 9 March 2024. Financial management is an important life skill that is closely related to life planning. This seminar aims to enrich participants' knowledge of financial skills and values that future financial talents should possess.

#### 2024 HKMA Business Stimulation for Secondary School Students

4 students (S5 & S6) joined the titled competition organized by HKMA. In the competition, students assumed the role of business managers, ran and managed the business, analyzed the business situation of the business, considered the external business environment and competitors, and used the finance, production, investment, marketing and human resources learned in school and business courses knowledge of resource management, etc., to formulate optimal strategies.

#### (13) Physical Education Department

Physical Education is "education through the physical". We aim to develop students' physical competence and knowledge of movement and safety, and their ability to use these to perform in a wide range of activities associated with the development of an

active and healthy lifestyle.

To promote urban sports that are popular among young people in recent years, skateboarding class were launched under the Urban Sports Funding Scheme. We also joined the Sai Sha Sports Park Explorer Program. Students experienced Lacrosse and Tennis in the Sports Park. In summer vacation, we enrolled the "Visits to Riding School and Pony Ride 2024-25" organized by the Equestrian Sports Promotional Programme. Students developed a better understanding of the equestrian sports.

Inter-house sports competitions were held throughout the year. The 51st Annual Athletic Meets were completed in March. More than 400 students participated in the competition, and about 150 students serviced during the Sport Days. Students' perseverance and a positive attitude were cultivated. Students with different abilities could also contribute to participating in the competition, as we believe in "SPORTS FOR ALL, HEALTH FOR ALL".

#### (14) Library

The second phase of renovation for the library will be finished in October. A new reading and learning environment with the elements of STEAM will be developed gradually. Library tours and reading lessons were conducted for S1 students to help them adapt to an English and eLearning environment with Kindles and eFun Tables.

In order to cultivate students' reading interests and habits, the Cross-Subject Reading Scheme was implemented in S1-3 to promote learning English through reading. The Extensive Reading Scheme was implemented in S1-5 to encourage students to initiate their own learning progress. Three S5 Students were awarded Harvard Book Prizes for their high reading achievements. They were invited to share their reading and learning habits with student librarians.

In order to integrate virtual reality (VR) and e-Learning into Chinese language education. Students were encouraged to do their Chinese reading reports with various ebooks from our online library (eclass plus). Our school also participated in the "Jockey Club VR Project for Enhancing Chinese Language Literacy" which was organised by the Centre for Learning Sciences and Technologies of The Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK). The project aims at integrating VR technologies

to enhance the effectiveness of learning and teaching Chinese language. Immersed in the virtual literary scenes, students can learn how to observe places, communities and people. It will strengthen their Chinese reading and writing proficiency, literary literacy and humanistic care.

The library will continue to engage in building a reading atmosphere with various activities. Local and overseas cultural tours were expected to be worthwhile. The "Cultural trip in Hangzhou" and "Australia (Perth) Youth Exchange Program" aim to enable students to widen their global exposure and broaden their international horizons. The activities encourage students to "read the world and understand our society", showing students how books are not only stories of the past but are also stories of personal life experience.

The following subjects were taught in Chinese.

(15) 中國語文科

初中除恆常單元教學外,特設電子教學。通過電子教學,創設有利即時回 饋的教學環境,增加師生討論,從而更深入理解作品的思想和内容,領會當 中的意境。高中恆常單元教學,旨在提高學生讀寫聽說能力、思維能力、審 美能力和自學能力,培養他們品德,加強其對社群的責任感。

拔尖補底方面,我們邀請中一至中五各級語文尖子參加閱讀寫作班,通過 評賞優秀的文學作品,提升學生的文學閱讀品味,啟發創意思維,及提升寫 作興趣。除照顧尖子外,為鞏固學生中文科知識,增加學習時數,學校更增 設課後支援班,以照顧不同學生的需要。

延伸學生學習課時亦是我們重點工作之一,我們鼓勵學生參與電子閱讀計 劃,提升學生語文自學能力。本年度學校繼續安排中二學生參加賽馬會「觸 境生情」虛擬實境中國語文教學計劃,希望通過運用虛擬實境科技,激發學 生的學習動機,提升他們對景物人情的觀察力和觸覺,啟發個人思考。

聯課活動方面,我們推薦及指導學生參加不同形式校内、校外比賽及語文 活動,讓學生有更多元的學習經歷。

#### (16) 普通話科

本科透過聆聽、說話、閱讀和拼寫四個學習範疇,培養學生普通話口語 溝通能力,以及學習本科的興趣、態度和習慣。聆聽和說話的學習,要求學 生能聽能說,能準確地理解和表達,以滿足學習、生活和日後工作的需要。 閱讀和拼寫的學習,注重語言的積累,語感和自學能力的培養,以輔助聆聽 和說話的學習。

另外,本科組織各種學習活動,例如猜謎語、講故事、角色扮演、做遊 戲、聽廣播、朗讀、朗誦、報告、討論及比賽。通過以學生為中心的教學設 計,使學生愉快地學習,把所學的語言技能運用於實際生活中。在推廣普通 話工作上,本科推動學生參加校際朗誦節比賽及推行每週一次的早會宣佈, 並設有學生分享環節,以普通話進行時事、書籍及故事的分享。而在校內舉 行普通話日活動中,透過普通話攤位遊戲、短劇表演及壁佈等,延展課堂所 學。藉著以上種種活動,務使學生取得良好的學習效果。

(17) 中國歷史科

科任老師致力設計多元化的課業,舉辦各類活動,以符合不同同學的需求。透過循序漸進的方式引導學生融入學習生活,鼓勵他們積極參與,建立 正面價值觀,提升國民身份認同感,強化國家觀念,培養對中國歷史的驕傲 感以及對香港及國家的歸屬感。

本年度國民教育主題為「龍的傳人」,本組成功安排同學參與各種延展 活動,包括:百人齊紮燈「龍」賀中秋、龍年賀卡設計比賽、龍年新年掛飾 製作、第四屆招商局集團香港青年讀書月活動、第十屆《憲法》及《基本法》 全港校際問答比賽、「歷史好好玩」全港中學生網上閱讀獎勵計劃、參觀選 舉資訊中心、中一級「龍袍設計比賽」、中二級「《憲法》及《基本法》標 語設計比賽」、中三級 2024《憲法》和《基本法》「見證·新時代」創意作品 製作比賽。同時,本校參與教育局舉辦的《憲法》及《基本法》學生校園大

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使計劃,共有30位來自中二至中五的同學參與該計劃為同學提供不同機會, 讓他們認識並協助推廣《憲法》、《基本法》及國家安全等訊息。

在師生共同努力下,本校獲得教育局「傳承.想創——積極推廣中國歷 史與中華文化學校嘉許獎」、「積極推廣中國歷史與中華文化教師獎」以及 學生「積極學習中國歷史與中華文化獎」、教育局《憲法》及《基本法》學 生校園大使培訓計劃「積極籌辦校本活動獎」、政制及内地事務局合作舉辦 的「致基本法的信」活動,7位同學獲得「優秀作品獎」。此外,在教育局舉 辦的「國民教育吉祥物命名比賽」中,本校3A鄭樂怡獲得了「大嘴鳥命名優 異獎」、「中華白海豚命名優異獎」以及「熊貓理念優異獎」。而在「情定 歷史」全港中學生比賽中,本校的3A鄒寶茹及3B溫芷柔獲得普及版嘉許獎。 此外,香港青年培育協會舉辦的「一國兩制」與《基本法》標語創作比賽2024 中,本校3D陳仲敏獲得季軍及3A陳君灝獲得優異獎。

至於内地交流團方面,本科組安排 10 位同學參加教育局舉辦的《憲法》 和《基本法》學生校園大使培訓計劃舉辦的「國民教育學生上海五天學習團」。 同時安排修讀中國歷史科的中四及中五同學參加「福建省歷史文化及海上絲 路考察之旅」。本科也推薦同學參加由民政及青年事務局和青年發展委員會 資助的内地交流團,曾到過的地點包括內蒙古、吉林、鄭州、開封、洛陽、 北京等。透過這些活動,提升學生對自身民族的自信心和自豪感,進而建立 國民身份認同,豐富生活的內涵。

(18) 宗教教育科

本科藉著課堂向學生傳遞基督信仰知識,並以聖經為基礎,幫助學生建 立正面價值觀。透過各式活動,包括各級的聖經金句實踐計劃、讀經計劃及 電影生命教育,鼓勵學生反思生命及實踐基督教信仰。又與宗教組及校牧合 作,鼓勵同學參予全完堂教育主日、學校團契及各項福音活動等,讓同學從 多方面接觸信仰。本年度在各班邀請及組織福音關懷大使,年中與小火子機 構合辦進行多次培訓工作坊,製作中一祝福小禮包。另外科組亦推動中五同 學寫下祝福及金句(加力仔),鼓勵中六同學勇敢面對公開考試。 在活動方面,本科與視藝科合作舉辦初中以宗教為題的平面設計比賽, 視覺藝術科利用課堂教導同學簡報設計及西洋法 讓同學發揮藝術天份之餘, 更多認識聖經章節。此外,亦嘗試在各級進行「讀經計劃——約翰福音」, 培養同學讀經的習慣,從而增加同學在課餘接觸聖經知識的機會,提升學校 宗教氣氛。

(19) 視覺藝術科

今年同學參加了一些校外比賽及領袖訓練活動。4D 蔡騫渝同學在「香港 賽馬會社區資助計劃:藝育菁英計劃——全港青少年繪畫比賽 2024」賽獲得 冠軍;2A 黃正同學在「中秋節填色及繪畫比賽 2023」獲得銀獎;6B 許晴怡 同學及6B 葉國欣同學在「九龍倉全港中學生繪畫比賽 2022-2023」獲得入圍 獎;2A 黃正同學及2C 熊綺婷同學在「春暖花開填色及繪畫比賽 2024」分別 獲得亞軍及季軍;3B 張曉嵐同學、5D 王穎琛同學及5C 李雅麗同學入圍第四 屆「梁棠盃全港中小學寫生比賽」;5C 李雅麗同學、4D 黃藍同學及4D 周殷 彤同學在「『中環綠色奇緣』繪畫及填色比賽」獲得少年組創意獎,同時4D 蔡騫渝同學、4D 趙釨鍒同學同獲金獎,4D 朱曉盈同學獲銀獎,另外4B 梁渟 婷同學、徐嘉兒同學及5D 王穎琛同學獲銅獎。

(20) 音樂科

透過音樂科,讓學生獲得豐富的學習經歷。課堂内,學生參與創作、聆聽、歌唱及樂器演奏等活動。課堂外,學生參加不同的音樂活動,如中西樂器訓練班、口琴班、手鈴隊、中西樂團、合唱團及工作坊等。

(22) 生活與社會科

本科積極配合其他個人、社會及人文教育學習領域的科目,教學重點內 容涵蓋個人與群性發展、資源與經濟活動及社會體系與公民精神,讓學生在 相關的學習領域有整全的學習。同時透過 PSHE 週的國家大型基建模型展加強 同學對學科內容的認識。

在國家安全及基本法教育的推行方面,本科安排充足的課時讓學生認識 基本法,並配以不同課堂活動、校際問答及國安寫作比賽,提升學生對相關 內容的了解程度。

本科亦積極策劃及設計電子學習教材,透過不同類型的教學活動增加課 堂的互動性。亦便利學生參與不同的校内活動,如博聞盃及校外比賽,如國 家安全、憲法與基本法網上問答比賽。

(23) 公民與社會發展科

本科強調幫助同學生了解香港、國家及當代世界的狀況,以及其多元化 和互相依存的特質。我們課程的設計原則在建立同學應有的知識、技能、價 值觀和態度。為此,科任老師致力製作多項適切教材,配合同學的學習需要 及滿足本科的教學宗旨。

在基本法及國安教育推行方面,本科安排學生參觀社區安全體驗館及參加一帶一路國家公共衛生發展講座,並配以教育局舉辦的不同校際問答、壁報設計比賽,以提升同學對相關內容的了解。同學均的踴躍參與各項比賽。

本科著重同學的親身體驗。中五同學參加了教育局安排的前海南沙經濟 發展考察團。本校亦安排同學參與<u>湖南</u>文化考察團,本科更策劃<u>深州</u>生物科 技及文化考察和<u>珠海</u>航天科技及歷史考察。本地考察團亦參觀了<u>筲箕灣</u>廟宇 群,同時體驗了舞龍、茶道、魚湯麵根及手打墨丸製作。以上活動皆為同學 提供了解及欣賞中華文化的機會。 本校社會科學學會支援公民與社會發展科舉辦多元學習活動。當中的博 聞盃社際問答比賽協助同學連繫各科學習,亦更深入了解國家安全的知識。 另外,學會和科組亦舉辦各項學習延展活動:花燈製作、花牌製作、賀年剪 紙、扎染、國家基建成就模型展示等,各項活動都大大增加同學對本科的學 習興趣。

#### (24) 國民教育組及國家安全教育組

本校國民教育組採取「多重進路」及課堂内外互相配合的形式,致力將國 民教育普及化,藉有系統的學習和舉辦多元化的跨組或跨科活動,培養學生 的國家觀念、國民身份認同和民族自豪感。依循「認識自我,立足香港,背 靠祖國,面向世界」的方向,學生能體驗及實踐正面價值觀及態度,並樂於 關顧家人、服務社會,認識自己的國民身份,願意為國家及民眾謀福祉,致 力貢獻國家及世界,建立積極人生的信念,讓國家的優良傳統、中華文化薪 火相傳下去。

國家安全教育是學校教育一個重要元素。香港特別行政區是中華人民共 和國不可分離的部分。維護國家安全是香港特別行政區的憲制責任,也是所 有香港居民的共同義務。本校國安教育小組除致力幫助學生認識國家的最新 發展,加強國民身份認同,亦致力向學生解釋國家安全相關的概念、《香港 國安法》的立法背景、内容及意義等,確保學生能獲得正確的資訊,清晰了 解及正確解讀《香港國安法》,理解國家安全的重要性,正確認識香港特別 行政區的憲制地位和「一國兩制」的基本原則。 我們更不斷提醒教職員和學 生遵守法律,加強防範和制止任何人士在學校進行任何違反《基本法》、《香 港國安法》和所有適用於香港的法律的教學和活動,以免干擾學校的正常運 作及影響學生學習,並致力培養學生尊重法治的精神,成為守法的良好國民 和公民,共同維護國家的安全。

#### **IV Support for Student Development**

#### 1. Religious Affairs

The Religious Committee plans and organises religious activities in the school. The committee works in close collaboration with the CCC Chuen Yuen Church and the School Chaplain and they are actively involved in our gospel activities.

This year, the theme of the Monday Morning Devotion was 'Care for others, Empathy, Respect for others, Integrity, Diligence and Perseverance' which were the priority values and attitudes of Values Education promoted by the Education Bureau. Bible verses and messages related to the theme were chosen and shared by the teachers and the School Chaplain. Gospel and Caring Ambassadors and committee members of the Student Christian Fellowship joined the training sessions organized by the Little Fire limited. They were trained and encouraged to serve others. Regular meetings of the Student Christian Fellowship were held on Friday and student disciples were involved in leading the meetings with the help of teacher advisors and the School Chaplain. Prayer meetings, religious cell group meetings and teacher fellowship meetings were held regularly. Various activities were organized during Gospel week and external organizations and guests were invited to hold gospel meetings and religious assemblies. It was hoped that our students would share the love of Jesus Christ and become His disciples.

#### 2. Discipline Committee

Our students were self-disciplined and positive about their school life. The campus order was good and the number of violations to school rules remained low. Our discipline teachers, other colleagues and prefects contributed a lot in maintaining an orderly and harmonious school environment.

To cultivate our students with positive values and attitudes, various tasks were done. The training of monitors was held in collaboration with the Guidance Committee and the SEN Team. Adventure training for junior form students and prefects was arranged to enhance their self-confidence, leadership and team spirit. An interclass quiz competition was held to deliver messages of being 'law-abiding' and having 'integrity'. Six students attained a silver award in the ICAC iTeen Leader Programme and they helped a lot in organising activities (including a virtual visit to ICAC, microfilm watching and a quiz competition) for other students. Students were encouraged to achieve their goals by joining the Demerit Offset Scheme and completing more demanding discipline-related items of the Chuen Yuen All-Round Award Scheme (CYARAS). The number of successful applications in CYARAS has significantly increased while some students needed more encouragement and guidance to offset their demerits.

#### 3. Guidance Committee

In collaboration with the school social workers from the Hong Kong Christian Service and the educational psychologist of CCC, the Guidance Committee is responsible for the planning and implementation of counselling work.

This year, the Peer Counselling Scheme trained 28 senior form peer counsellors to assist 43 S1 newcomers to adapt to the new school life. In response to one of the foci in the Annual School Plan, 'Achieving goals with perseverance', the Committee worked closely with other committees to formulate and implement classroom management. 7 Habits learning materials were distributed to all students in the MCED lesson. All learning materials were tailor-made for different student groups. Besides, sex education lessons were delivered to all forms. We also launched guidance booth day and Christmas activities to spread the seeds of "caring culture" in the school, and promote positive values, such as "love" and "thanksgiving". All participants enjoyed themselves.

The Guidance Committee also aims to promote students' awareness on mental health. Systematic emotional education was held in MCED lessons continuously. Mental health education school assembly and a Mosaic Art making workshop for senior forms was introduced. We partnered with Levelmind @JC-Caritas (Kwai Tsing) to provide a series of art therapy workshops for junior students. The mental health group was set up in a secured environment so that participants could release their stresses with others' understanding, acceptance and sympathy. Besides, we arranged two assemblies for both junior and senior students to teach them the importance of mental health. This particularly strengthened students and helped them appreciate different stages of mental health and the real messages behind these changes. Students were encouraged to release their stresses, to accept, and to learn how to befriend their mental health. To help teachers understand the importance of counseling, we offered a professional seminar for all teachers during staff development Day.

To help students acquire problem-solving skills, develop their potentials in leadership and strengthen their confidence, concerted efforts were made. Various parties organized activities like the training programme for junior form monitors and monitresses, and the adventure-based counselling programmes. The performance of students was commendable. We also provided a talk and worshop for parents. Our school social workers, Miss Mandy Law, Mr. Alex So and Miss Tiffany Wong provided quality services to students. They helped students in developing their personal growth, particularly in overcoming learning difficulties and leading to a harmonious family life. They designed leaflets for parents to inform them about the physical and mental changes from P.6 to S.1. They also took calls from parents to hear their concerns. Regarding senior forms, they provided effective tips on stress relief to help students acquire positive thinking towards examinations. Small souvenirs were constantly prepared for students as a blessing. The Instagram platform was welcomed by students.

We would like to thanks Mr. Chow Tze Chung, the educational psychologist, and other professionals for their help with the above.

#### 4. Career Guidance Affairs

The Careers Committee organises career planning activities for all students. This year, the Committee collaborated with St. James' Settlement, Hok Yau Club, CityU SCOPE, HKU SPACE, Hong Kong Community College, Leo Club of Ho Man Tin, Hong Kong Association of Careers Masters and Guidance Masters and other local and overseas institutes of further studies in the delivery of life planning education and career guidance programmes.

The Committee further extended the life planning activities to junior forms, including self-understanding and goal setting lessons in S1, careers exploration activities in S2 and S3. S1 participated in the programme "生涯起動" and S3 joined the group counselling activities on subject selection matters organized by St. James' Settlement under the 'Funding Scheme for Youth Life Planning Activities 2022-25'. S2 engaged in a Career Programme which leant the key elements of career planning. Students gained insights through hand-on experience into the characteristics and requirements of skillsets for a selected occupation. It is hoped that students can start planning for their future career earlier.

Senior forms enjoyed various career-related courses and programmes. For example, selected S4 and S5 students joined the Applied Learning courses Creative English – PR and Marketing and Vocational English – English for Service Professionals respectively on Saturday morning. For the cohort 2022 – 2024 of Vocational English,

among 46 students, 3 of them obtained Attained with Distinction II (6.5%), 14 of them obtained Attained with Distinction I (30.43%) and 45 of them fulfilled both the attendance and subject requirement. The workshops on 'Career Live' provided the chance for S4 students to participate in taster programmes of aviation service, e-sports and engineering, advertising media and healthcare industry. For S5, students participated in Education and Career Expo 2024. Career exploration and job shadowing activities were held on Life-wide Learning Day. Valuable experience on working in social media, education institution, legal firm and toys manufacturing company were obtained. 'My life planning portfolio' was introduced to senior form students. The portfolio aims to help students know themselves better through various career assessment tools, devise plans for personal development, set and modify goals through self-reflection, and grasp various study and career pathways, so that them can make wise choices for future study or employment. Mock release of the HKDSE result and non-JUPAS talks were implemented in S6. All these events were well-received.

#### 5. Extra-curricular Activities Committee

The Extracurricular Activities Committee organizes various training and activities to enrich students' learning experience and instill positive values and attitudes such as responsibility and perseverance.

#### Leadership Training

We focus on training our students to be "Chuen Yuen Leaders." Thus, this year, different leadership training courses for class, club, and house committee members were held to build students' generic skills in organizing events. Positive feedback was received, and students agreed that the courses could enhance their leadership skills.

Nearly 80 of our Chuen Yuen Leaders attended an overnight Camp at HKAYP Jockey Club Duke of Edinburgh Training in December. The camp enhanced students' perseverance, problem-solving, and communication skills.

Thirty-five students from S3 volunteered join the Outward Bound Training. In the four-day training, students built resilience by overcoming challenges, showing empathy for peers who may be struggling, making personal decisions, and accepting responsibility for success or failure through the adventure-based experiential education model. Students strengthened their skills and became more responsible, motivated, and capable leaders when they returned to school.

#### Student Union

The Students' Union "Infinitum" was formed this year. It organized academic, recreational, and sports activities and offered services to CYC students. To foster students' unity and sense of belonging, the "Chuen Yuen Festival" was held during the post-exam period. S3 to S5 classes had to design and decorate their classroom according to the Theme "World Festival". Stalls in the classroom crowded with visitors.

Music Competition, Dance Battle, Foot Darts and "Chuen Yuen's Got Talent" Show were also held in the Hall and covered playground. Laughter and excitement filled the entire playground.

#### Houses

We have four Houses named from the Bible: Wisdom, Faith, Hope, and Love. Each House comprises staff and students from all year levels. Students are encouraged to participate in a range of house competitions. We stress building a sense of identity and belonging, which helps foster school spirit.

#### Clubs and Society

Our school offers eighteen sports teams and twenty clubs and societies covering academic, religious, service, interest, and sports categories. This allows students to enjoy a diverse range of extracurricular activities and enrich their learning experiences. Their talents are unleashed, and their potential is stretched. Students learn from success or failure through systematic training or competition. We have certainly produced a fruitful school year and hope to provide a fruitful life for them continuously.

#### 6. Moral and Civic Education Committee

Values education was made the focus of Moral and Civic Education (MCED) this year. Positive values and healthy outlook on life have gradually been fostered among our students under the whole-school approach.

The MCED Committee has updated the present MCED curriculum, holistic and balanced, cultivating the priority values and attitudes among students, namely 'Perseverance', 'Respect for Others', 'Responsibility', 'National Identity', 'Commitment', 'Integrity', 'Care for Others', 'Law-abidingness', 'Empathy' and 'Diligence'. With Chinese culture as a backbone, 'Benevolence', 'Filial piety' and 'Unity' have been added as the priority values.

A series of activities were held, echoing the theme of the MCED Committee, 'Be grateful and treasure what we have!'. Adventure training was one of the highlights. The event was held in September for all S.1 classes. Almost all adventure tasks were set at a more challenging level at both indoor and outdoor venues, including the high wall. The main goals were achieved–enhancing students' ability of self-understanding, communication and collaboration and encouraging creativity in the adventure games.

In addition to the core curriculum of the MCED, we organised community services and activities to instil a sense of responsibility toward caring for the elderly community among our students. Feedback received from the elderly participants in the service day was mostly positive. They expressed substantial satisfaction with the students' performances and appreciation for the company during the activities. They indicated that these interactions gave them new and unique experiences, some of whom have never been to a school before. tHey were extremely grateful for the comfortable environment on the campus. They spent a delightful morning, expressing profound gratitude towards the students for creating an inclusive experience.

In a bid to promote academic excellence alongside personal development, a selection of our persistent students were brought to participate in the 第三屆「四維八德踐行獎」 competition. This event, organized by the Hong Kong Federation of Education Writers, drew attention to the unwavering commitment of young minds across the region. Our chosen candidates for this event, consisting of four hardworking S.2 students and an equally ambitious S.4 student, had prepared the written documents for introducing themselves. They were granted an interview. Even though they did not enter the final round, such an interview chance could enrich their learning curve.

To promote national education and to help students develop a sense of belonging to the country, have an affection for the Chinese people as well as enhancing their sense of national identity, 30 national flag raising ceremonies were held in all forms throughout this academic year. 'Talks under the national flag' were also given.

To enrich the elements of promoting life education, on 5 Oct, S.2A students were sponsored to watch the movie "Starlight". The story told the inspirational story of an ordinary rural primary school skipping team in Guangzhou. Under the leadership of a physical education teacher and young volunteer teachers, they continued to have a breakthrough and finally became world champions in skipping. The feedback from students and teachers was very positive. To sum up, the positive values nurtured in students' minds have not only helped them develop a healthier life perspective and a more positive learning attitude, but also equipped them with the adaptability required in their future workplace. It is hoped that being positive and responsible citizens, our students will make the world a better place.

### 7. Whole School Approach to Integrated Education

The school's Student Support Team is run under the supervision of the vice principal in-charge of student affairs and led by a SENCO. Other members include a SEN teacher, class teachers and subject teachers of the students with SEN. Working with the Academic Committee, Discipline Committee, Guidance Committee and Examinations Team, the Student Support Team offers cross-functional support to SEN students; and if necessary, school social workers, educational psychologists and other professionals provide assistance. There is a speech therapist stationed at our school this year and this service offers further support to students with special education needs.

Based on professional advice and with the consent of parents, the school considers the learning needs of students with SEN. Example include: social skills training; speech therapy; reading and writing training; integration activities, and adjustments to assessments. The school has utilised various grants such as the Learning Support Grant to provide support for SEN students. Personalised study plans were also formulated for individual students. Various talks and workshops were held for parents and teachers in order to strengthen the support for students with SEN. The members of the Student Support Team communicated and collaborated closely with parents to understand the needs of the students. The team also invited parents, teachers and other professionals to meetings and interviews to discuss students' progress and gather opinions, which, if necessary, were passed on to the relevant groups for follow-up.

### 8. Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students

The school encourages and supports the early integration of non-Chinese speaking (NCS) students. NCS students' learning of Chinese is facilitated through adaptation to the local education system. Recognized Chinese assessments are arranged for and taken by NCS students according to their needs. In order to provide educational support, the school has spent the Enhancing Support for Learning and Teaching Chinese for Non-Chinese Speaking Students Funding in various aspects. The school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese, providing after-school support programmes in learning Chinese, and organizing cultural integration activities.

Activities organised by the Parent-teacher Association were categorised as follows:

#### 10. Alumni Association

The Twenty-ninth Chuen Yuen College Alumni AGM and the Poon Choi Dinner was held on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2023. The alumni offered over seventy scholarships of about a hundred thousand dollars to students with outstanding performances in academic work, services, or activities. During this year, three newsletters concerning the Election of Alumni Manager of the IMC the AGM and the Poon Choi Dinner were published. Three directors' meetings were held to discuss the alumni affairs.

### 11. Cultural Exchange Committee

To promote cultural understanding and appreciation among students through various cultural exchange programs and sharing sessions, in order to foster cultural awareness, we organize and coordinate the Local, Mainland or Oversea Cultural Exchange Tours for students.

Cheung Chau Local Tour focusing on DIY bun-making provided students with hands-on and interactive cultural experience. Besides, an in-depth understanding of Cheung Chau's local customs, traditions and festivals, such as the famous Cheung Chau Bun Festival highlighted the island's rich cultural heritage.

Mainland Cultural Exchange Tours aim to strengthen exchanges in various fields between young people in mainland and Hong Kong. In order to enhance students' sense of national identity and promote Chinese culture, the Hangzhou Literature Tour was designed for students to explore the rich literary heritage of Hangzhou. The tour provided students with insights into the historical context that shaped the literature of Hangzhou. Besides, Hong Kong Youth Tour to Qinghai allowed students to gain a deep understanding of Qinghai's culture, geological features and green energy in Qinghai Province.

Australia (Perth) Youth Exchange Program aims to provide students with opportunities to engage in cultural exchange and personal development. Six students visited different colleges in Perth, including Murdock University, Curtin University and Phoenix Academy School, to learn about the local school culture. They also took part in various volunteer services, such as visiting the homeless, an elderly home, food bank and the Wheelchairs For Kids factory to make wheelchairs and organise fund-raising activities for the Charity Bazaar.

### 12. Energy Saving Team

The team's goal is promote awareness of sustainable development through various environmental activities. In order to improve participation and communication across school personnel on energy conservation and green policy, we focus on reducing energy consumption, improving efficiency and promoting sustainable practices in school.

Our team installed the Solar Energy Generation System accompanied by educational activities or workshops. Our school joined Solar Harvest - Solar Energy Support Scheme which was provided by the Electrical and Mechanical Services Department (EMSD). Besides, we made the best use of the system installed to promote environmental education when participating in the Feed-in Tariff (FiT) Scheme.

During the Energy Saving Week, a solar car workshop was organized for students to learn how to make a greener model car that could convert renewable solar energy into electricity more efficiently for use. Besides, we arranged a renewable energy talks and workshop for students to visit the solar panel site in the school rooftop to help them to consolidate their knowledge about energy conservation.

2. Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examinations 2024

105 Form 6 students sat the HKDSE 2024 and they performed very well. 29 students scored Level 5-5\*\* in one or more subjects. 16 students scored Level 5-5\*\* in two or more subjects.

Our S.6 students obtained 384 Level 3 or above. On average each student attained Level 3 or above in 3.7 subjects. Average passing percentage of four core subjects and 13 elective subjects are 99.1% and 96.3% respectively. All these figures including the percentage of our students meeting the basic university entrance requirement (332A2) and 222A2 are high above Hong Kong averages.
